



The national flag of Singapore was first adopted in 1965. It comprises two equal horizontal sections of red (on top) and white (below); red representing universal brotherhood while white symbolises everlasting purity and virtue. The National Stadium is part of the multi-purpose Singapore Sports Hub opened in 2014. The Stadium features the world's largest dome structure and a retractable roof. It has been custom-designed to host football, rugby, cricket and athletics events. Automated retractable seating also allows the space to be configured for concerts and entertainment programmes. The Sports Hub includes an aquatic centre, a multi-purpose arena, an indoor stadium, the Singapore Sports Museum and a shopping mall.


