With more than 50 original illustrations drawn on location, *Pulau Ubin: The Last Frontier* is a remarkable record of a truly unique place and way of life.







How long will these be around for? Will urban development soon claim this "last frontier"?


Join me on this journey to explore the beauty of Pulau Ubin.
