





I remember lying in bed one night after putting my son Ben Ben to bed. I thought to myself what I could, as a parent, give to Ben Ben when he reaches 21?


A wealthy person I am not. Therefore the options of a car or an inheritance is out. So what else could I give? I began to ponder.


I guess this is my little way of looking towards the future.
















# For Review bout the Authors
