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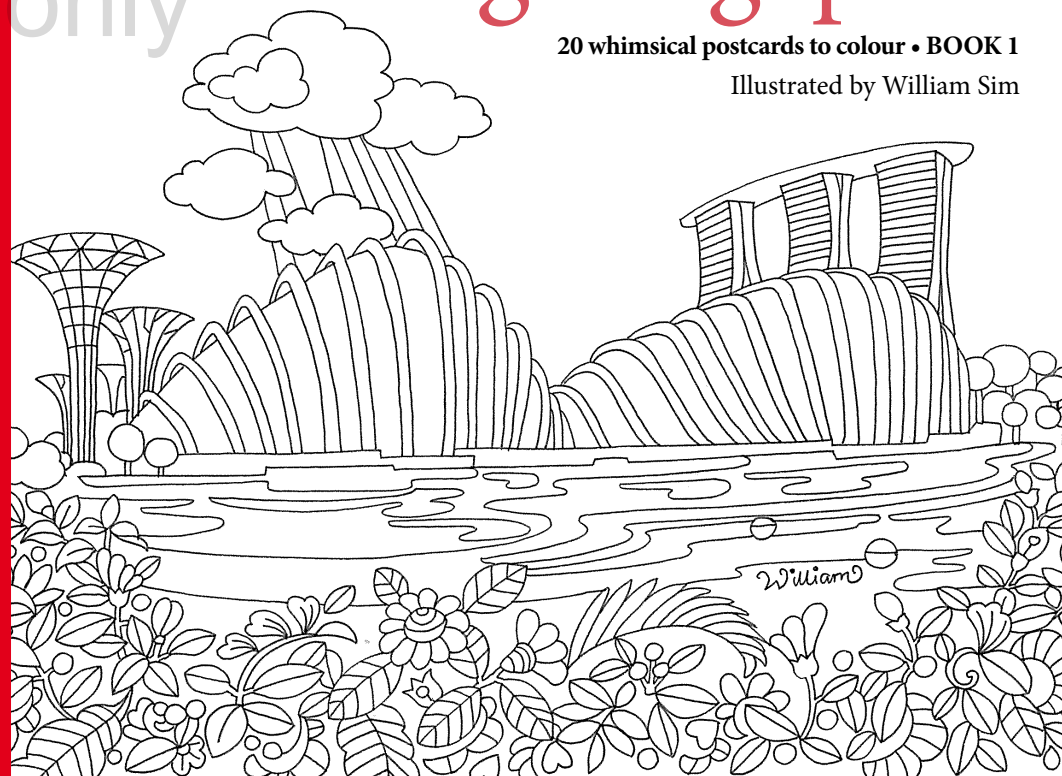


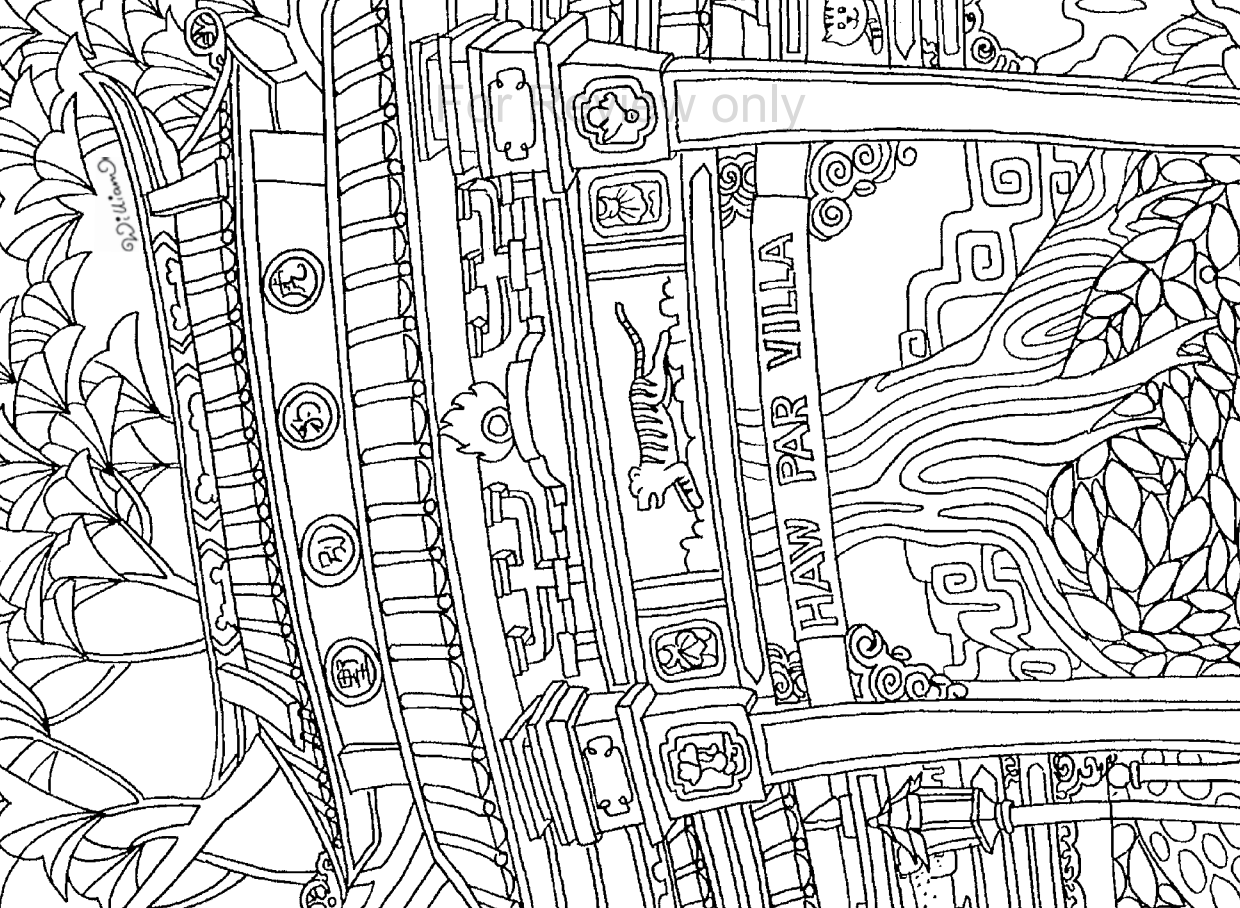

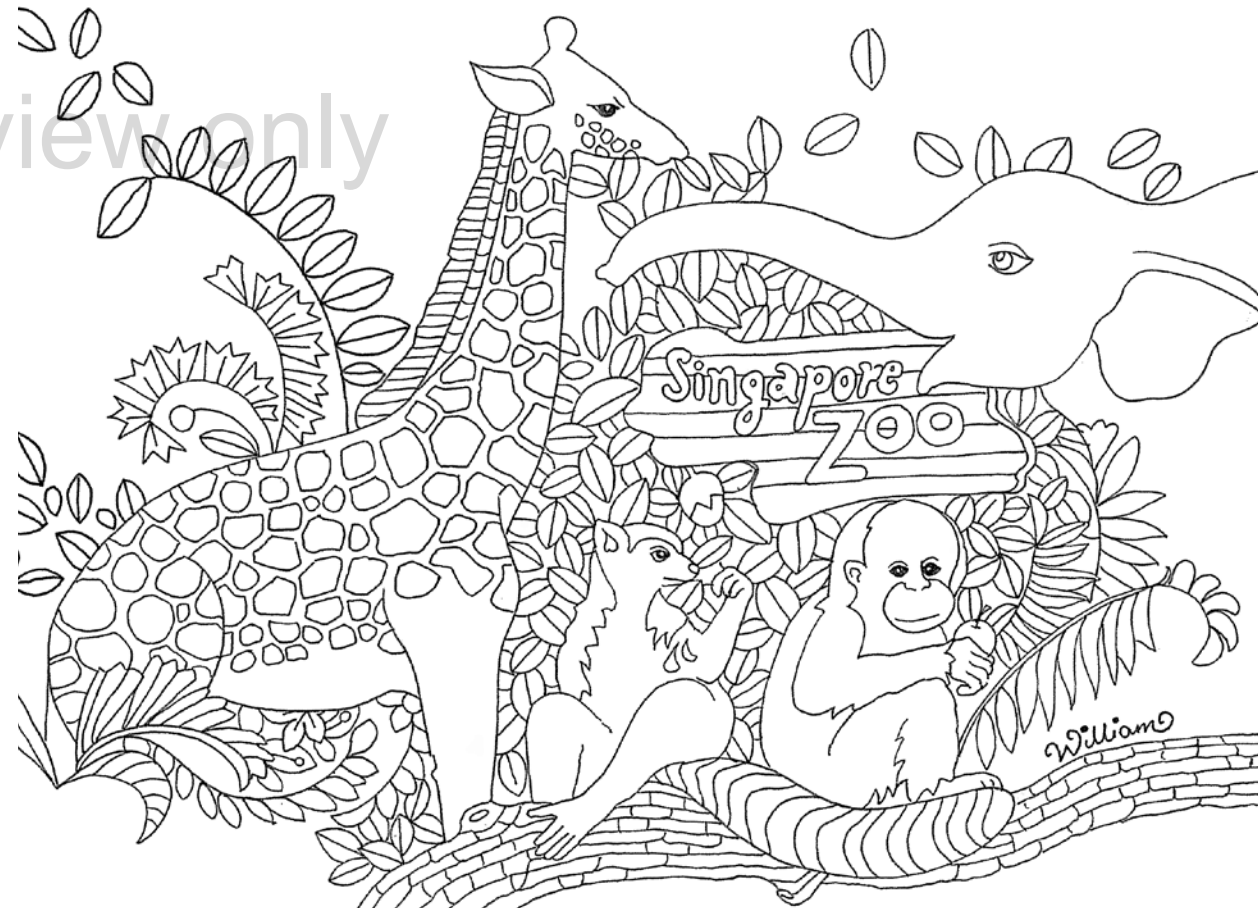
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HAW PAR VILLA

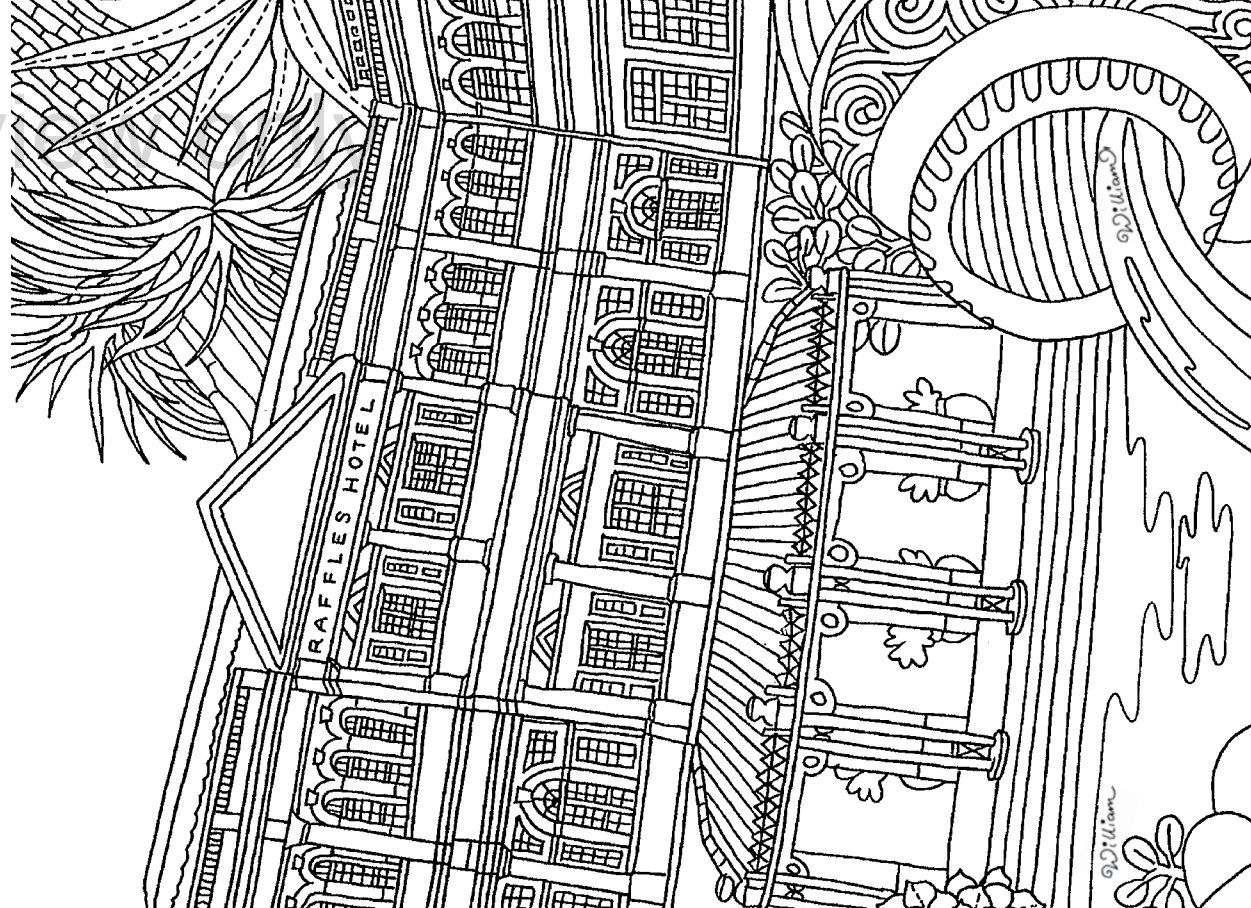
Haw Par Villa features over 1,000 statues and 150 displays depicting scenes from Chinese mythology, legend and history.

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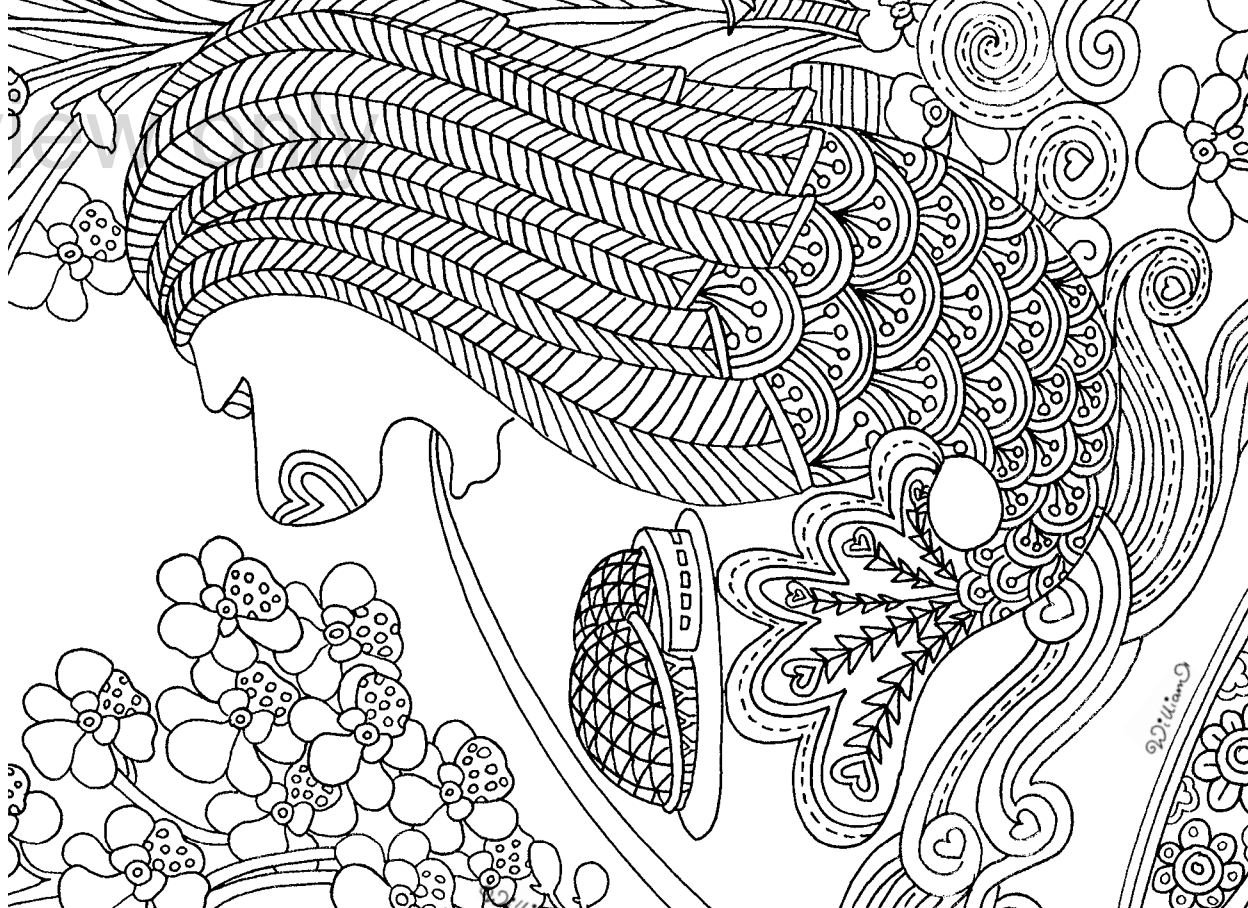
Animals at the Singapore Zoo are housed in a natural 'open' environment with hidden barriers, moats, and glass between the animals and visitors.

was built in 1887 by the Sarkies Brothers.

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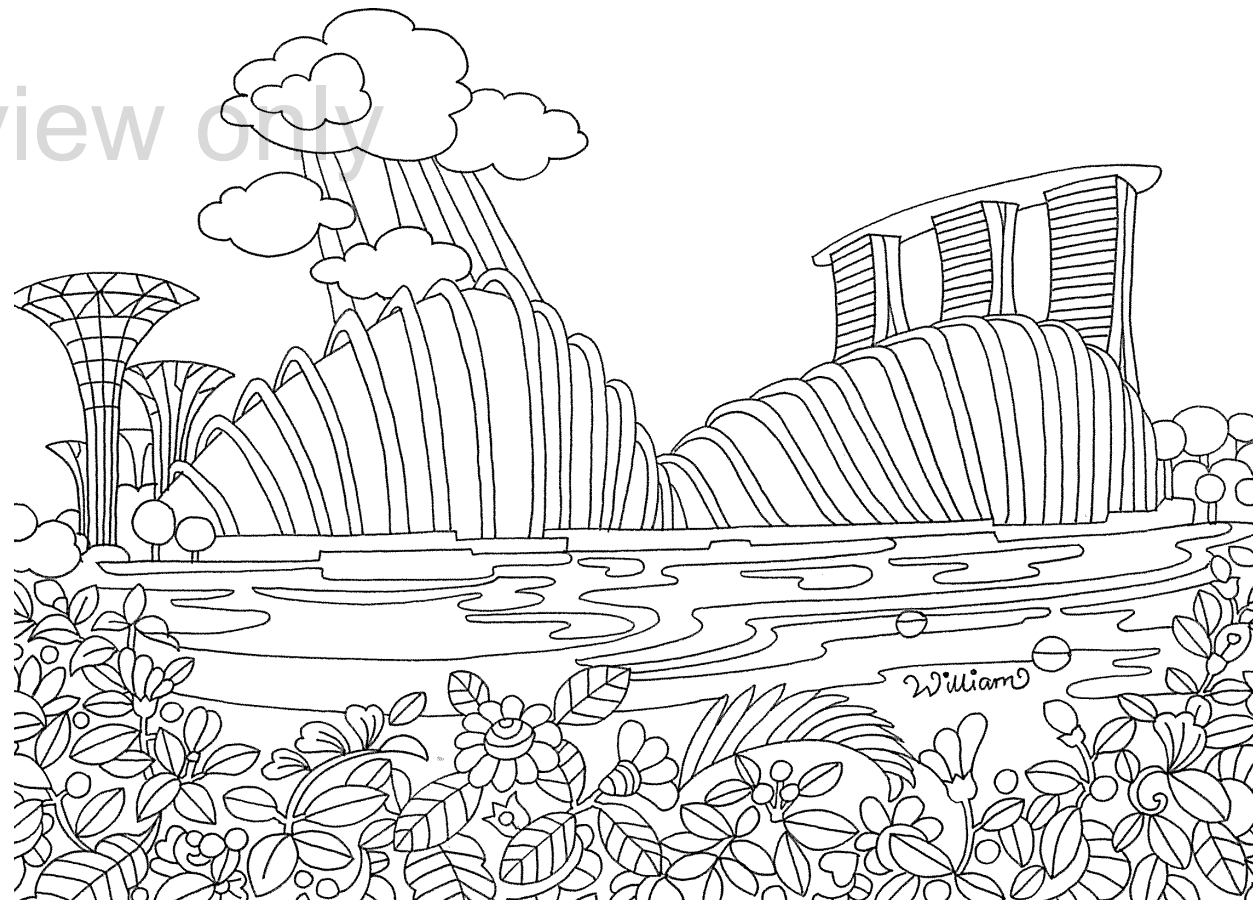
The Merlion, the Esplanade and orchids are symbols commonly associated with Singapore.

Traditional conservation shophouse dating back to the 19th century located along Neil Road on the outskirts of Chinatown.

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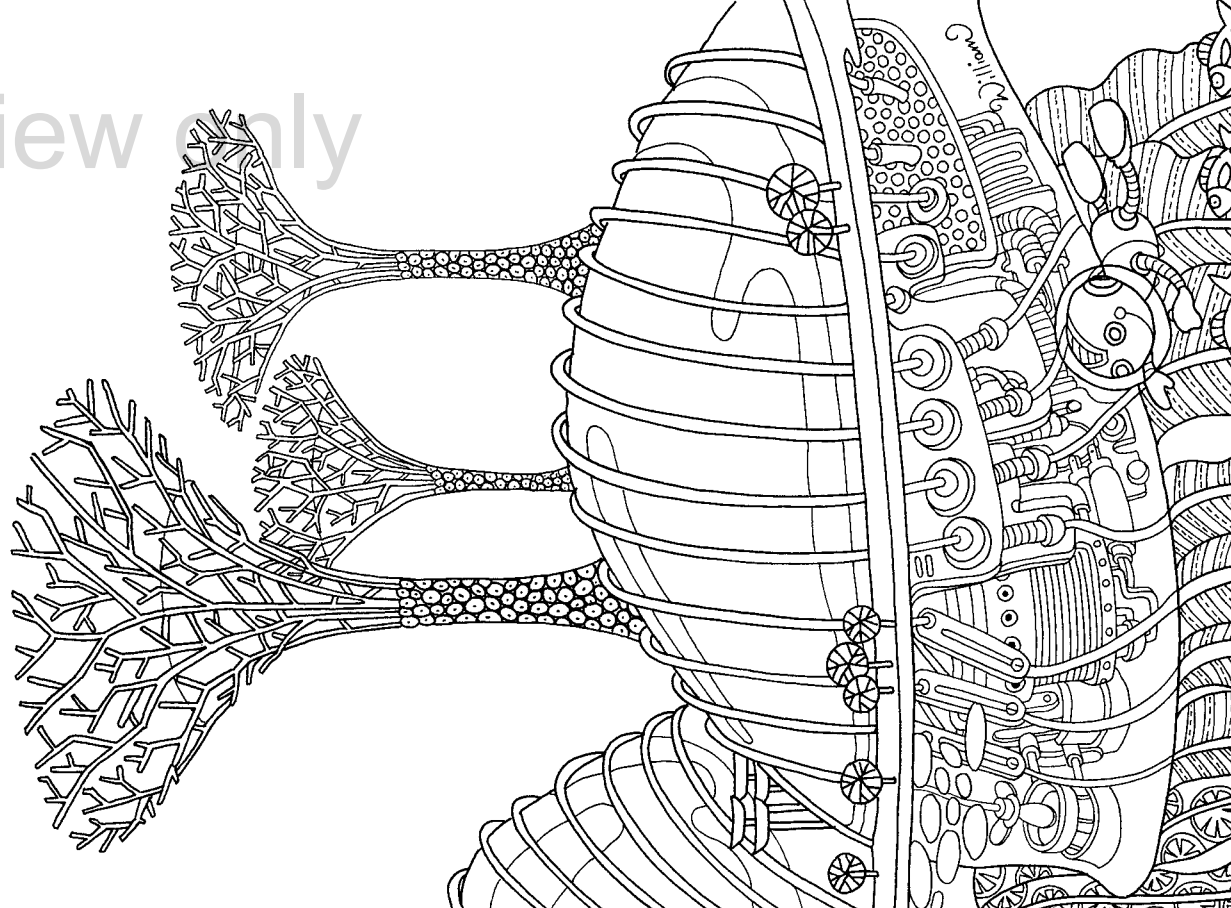
