

The Peranakan Museum located at Armenian Street is a showcase of the Straits Chinese community and its eclectic culture and history.




The Cloud Forest and Flower Dome are special conservatories that are home to plants and flowers not usually grown in Singapore.





Detail of *gopuram* (entrance tower) at the Sri Mariamman Temple, Singapore's oldest Hindu temple, located at South Bridge Road.




